



Neighborhood House was established more than a century ago (1905) to meet the needs of new immigrants in Southwest Portland. Today, we are a leading provider of comprehensive social and support services with programs serving low-income children, families and seniors throughout North, Southwest and Downtown Portland.

“Our mission is to bring neighbors together to feed the hungry, house the homeless, and educate young and old. We strengthen community by providing resources to support self-reliance, economic independence and dignity in people of all ages and backgrounds.”



Neighborhood House programs educate children and parents, feed and house families facing hunger and homelessness, and assist elders with independent living while providing the necessary structure to reduce social isolation. Cultural competency is a hallmark of our programs, and our services are tailored toward the ethnic diversity of our program participants, including Somali, Kurdish, Latino, Russian, African and Asian to name a few.

Approximately 18,000 individuals and families receive services from Neighborhood House each year. Nearly 75% are low income and 60% are members of minority groups.



A Growing Community

Our growth over the past decade has been significant, both fiscally and in our operations. Our annual budget for FY 2014/2015 is 5 million with approximately 20% from private support.
